Speakers:



Revd Prebendary Dr Isabelle Hamley is a writer, broadcaster and speaker. She is currently working as Theological adviser to the House of Bishops, after posts as Chaplain to the Archbishop of Canterbury, parish priest, university chaplain and theology tutor. Before ordination she was a probation officer. She is passionate about the Old Testament and has written in particular on the Bible and mental health, and on matters of justice, violence and faith. Most recently she has written the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book for 2022, Embracing Justice.



Revd Canon Dr Michael Leyden is the Dean of Emmanuel Theological College. He is enthusiastic about theologically rich and practically robust formation that equips Christian disciples for mission-shaped life today. He has played a key role in developing Emmanuel's vision and ethos and its distinctive approach to ministerial formation.

Michael specialises in the interface of theology and ethics, which probably grew out of his teenage concern with the question "so what?" Having come to faith at school, he was concerned to figure out what difference being

a disciple of Jesus could and should make to the kind of lives we lead.





Dr Liz Graveling is Senior Researcher in the Church of England's Ministry Development Team, where she conducts and advises on research in the area of lay and ordained ministry. Her academic background is in sociology and international development and she has expertise in qualitative research methods. Liz leads the 'Living Ministry' research programme, which is a mixed-methods study following four cohorts of clergy over a ten-year period to understand what helps them to flourish in ministry. She is the author of 'How Clergy Thrive: Insights from Living Ministry'.

Revd Lucy Foster is the Eco Church Officer for Northern England at the Christian environmental charity A Rocha UK. She is a self-supporting curate in the Helm Mission Community in south Cumbria. Originally from Kent she has lived in Kendal with her husband Jonathan since 2000. They are employed by their rescue cat Piggle.





Revd Jolyon Trickey launched and manages ReSource's Alongside Scheme, which offers prayerful one-to-one support for church leaders. Alongside forms part of the ministry of ReSource, which works to foster spiritual renewal for the purpose of mission, in churches of all kinds and traditions. ReSource has a particular heart for 'little, local and ordinary' churches, and believes small is beautiful in the kingdom of God. Jolyon has 25 years of church leadership experience, and prior to ReSource, he worked for the Anglican Communion Office co-ordinating a focus upon Intentional Discipleship world-wide.
